of Parliament

B

Bills introduced in the parliament

Public/Govt. Bill

- Brought by Minister
- It reflects of the policies of the Govt.
- It has greater chance to be approved
- Its rejection by the House amounts to the no-confidence in the govt & may lead to its resignation.
- Its introduction in the house requires 7 days notice
- It is drafted by the concerned department in consultation with the law department

Private Bills

- By Private Member
- If reflects the stand of opposition party
- It has lesser chance to be passed
- Its rejection by the house has no implication on the Parliamentary confidence in the Govt.
- Its introduction in the House requires one month's notice
- Its drafting is the responsibility of the member concerned.
