Corruption refers to the abuse of power to make misuse of funds at disposal in personal interests. In simplified form, corruption is the act of "gaining valuables at the cost of values"

Different forms:




14. The deepening value crisis in the contemporary Indian society is casting its evil in all walks of life, Analyze. (150 Words) (10 Marks)



One of the supporter of the minister informs you on your mobile phone that it is better if you do not interfere with and avoid confrontation.

What will you do in such a situation? Some of the options are given below. Evaluate the merits and demerits of these options and finally suggest what course of action, you would like to take giving reasons.

- (a) Arrest the minister along with his supporters and sieze his arms, ammunition and vehicles, and immediately file a criminal case in local police station.
- (b) Inform the election control room and seek police reinforcement, and also instructions as what to do?
- (c) Go to villages inhabbitated by members of S.C. and help them to cast their votes, by arranging vehicles.
- (d) Inform election observer and other senior authorities and seek their help and guidance, and till avoid the minister.
- (e) Ignore the minister and his supporters with the hope that they might be caught if they create any disturbance on the polling stations, because on every polling station a static arm picket has been stationed. (250 Words) (20 Marks)
