India Company made it the colony of mighty British Empire through the efforts of Robert Clive, Hastings, Dalhousie etc

It remained the most important colony of British empire known for plundering of wealth from Ganges to Thames

Later after 200 years of its colonial history, India gained Independence in 1947 through the efforts and sacrifices of leaders like Gandhiji, Bose, Bhagat Singh. The mass movement for independence helped in peaceful transfer of power (rare in those times).

Thus the above anecdote highlights how Rich legacies (Colonisation & Independence) are made and unmade by the efforts of both leaders and public. (mass support)

Rich legacies whether intra-national, inter-national or global are created or destroyed by the efforts of both leaders and people where leader acts as catalyzing agent to garner more support.

In this essay first we will analyse what do we mean by Rich legacies ? Then we will analyze the reasons why rich legacies are made/unmade by leader & people both ? Then we will see how this collaboration sometimes can create disaster rather than legacy. Lastly we will find out some measure to achieve harmonious cooperation.

Any rich legacy can be made through active support or collaboration of both leaders and people because it is difficult to challenge the status quo. To bring change ripples need to be created by the leaders and people of rationalism and positive thoughts.

For instance, France was under the control of repressive, anarchic monarchy. Leaders like Voltaire, Montesquieu created the ripples of liberty, equality and fraternity. This garnered support of public leading to Fall of Bastille and creating a rich legacy of Human Rights and democracy.

Similarly, slavery was deeply entrenched in American society so much so that they had a law legalising slavery. It required efforts Abraham Lincoln and the people of America to abolish it through constitutional amendment.

Creating Rich legacy is not an easy task , it requires diverse and out of box thinking and it also needs innovation and creativity, which can come through diverse participation of people and guidance by wise leader.

For instance, Indian constitution, one of longest written constitution is considered as a gem and marvel of democracy in entire world. It took almost 8 years for its conceptualisation and efforts of leaders like Ambertkar, B.N.Rau and people of India (public consultation)

Creation of UN required critical and out of box thinking to transition the whole world from monarchy, colonialism to democracy and independence. It was achieved through contribution of world leaders like Woodrow Wilson and the global world community (people).

Apart from diverse thinking, creation of rich legacy ~~requires~~ great acceptance and penetration for the 'New'. This creates behavioural change

which is necessary to transform a small riple into Rich legacy.

For instance, success of swaachh

Bharat Abhiyan in India depicts its Rich legacy. This can be achieved through inspirational leadership of Modiji and support of all Indians (Jan Andolan).

However, sometimes both leaders and peoples if mis-trained or ill-trained or ill-informed can create disasters. Thus the unethical or unhygienic nexus of corrupt leaders and people can cause destruction of rich legacies also of a legacy.

Thus we need to channelize the energy of our great leaders and people in right direction to create Right Rich legacy which can benefit humanity, environment and society in general.

Most importantly we need to develop scientific temper (fundamental duty) in our ~~ster~~ society to question the wrong and unjust and work for good and legal.


To summarise, we need synergy and cooperation between and leaders and people to create rich legacies like swech Bharat

Abhijan, Indian Independence, French Revolution etc. This synergic collaboration helps bring change in society and world in general.


