

The protest is because of two consecutive incidents that happened in your district. Case one: The city SP has received intelligence that bombs have been planted in various places in the city. The SP asked his team to conduct a massive search operation. After putting in strenuous hard work, the police team raided a house where two people with 2 kg of explosives and IED devices were found. The Police team immediately arrested them and brought them to the police station. Police started interrogating them about the whereabouts of the bombs and their plans. When they failed to get any information from them, one of the Police Officers adopted the third degree. Torture, in the case of new criminals, often works. But one of them died during the process, as he failed to bear the pain of torture. Death in police custody became a big issue. Case two: Recently communal riots occurred in your area and a few police constables got surrounded by a group, viewing the grave situation and a possible threat to life, one of them used a man as a human shield. 
