In this essay, we will try to answer these two questions by understanding what are decisions and how they are impacted by our value system? We will also delve into what are values and how ~~does~~^{is} our life reflected in the value based decision-making process? Finally, we will see some ways through which we can enrich our values and thus our decision.

Decisions are basically the choices that we make after judging all the alternatives that are present before us. Like after Matriculation, we judge all the streams - arts, commerce, science and others and then make a decision. One of the most significant reasons for why decisions are given such importance is because of the opportunity cost involved. We want to minimise this cost as much as possible. Like Gandhiji's decision to withdraw Non-Cooperation movement was to reduce the opportunity cost of corrupting our value system with violence.

This decision also shows us that every choice of ours is value based, like in Mahatma case it was not to compromise with non-violence. So what are these values that impact all our judgments? Values are basically abstract ideals or goals that a person wants to achieve. They are generally global in nature and not self-oriented, like honesty or kindness. These values make up the core of our personality, and thus become general determinants of all our behaviour. But how do they develop?

Values are not inherent but they develop through socialisation. When we socialise with our family, our friends, society and infiltrate our culture, we develop a personal value system. Like, Indian ethos and traditions develops the value of respecting & helping elders in us. This value has helped us to sustain collectivism in our society.

The life-long socialisation process develops a thinking pattern amongst us, that is laid with different values. When we take decisions, we ~~are~~ this thinking pattern. We then not only make a choice amongst the alternatives but also a choice amongst the different values associated with it. Every person has a hierarchy of values and the dominant values influence our decisions the most. Like, in America, most of the decisions are taken with capitalist mindset as their dominant values are individualism and materialism.

This hierarchy gets influenced and keeps on changing with our various life experiences. Various ^{previous} decisions and life events build up our frame of reference, thus impacting our future decisions. Like, ~~for Ashoka~~ after the brutal war of Kalinga, Ashoka's dominant values changed from conquest, expansion and materialism to non-violence, kindness and dhamma. Thus, his


