


Fig. representing India and USA.


Irritants in the India-USA relationship




Fig. Map of India and West Asia.

Significance of such a large population of diaspora:


- (1) Huge remittances to India - India is the largest recipient of remittances in the world.

- (3) Diaspora is also regarded as an ambassador for the country.
- (4) launching of rupee card in these countries are example.

- Help in containing china's approach in the region.



Shanghai Co-operation Organisation - is an 8 member organisation (India became its member in 2017). This organisation has huge potential like $\approx 50\%$ of world population, $1/3^{\text{rd}}$ of global GDP, & permanent UNSC member.
