He knows he will not pass his Std. 10th exams this year as well. There are no benches in his school. The teacher who hardly comes, speaks broken English. With no prospects in sight, he decides to drop out to help his father in the field.

Dealing with a broken system: certain issues

Firstly, there is the lack of public spending in education. India spends only 2.5% of GDP on education. This reflects in poor infrastructure in government schools.

Secondly, we see a lack of learning outcomes. AER report by PRATHAM points that hardly 50% of Class 5 students can read

a Class 2 text. Similar poor situation exists in solving simple maths problems.

Thirdly, is the issue of Teacher quality. Many are not up to the mark & impart wrong education. Teacher Absenteeism is also high (33%) as per World Bank.

Combined with other issues like lack of Vocational training, Value education, Inclusion, Remedial Assistance, etc. it leads to nearly 17% of students dropping out by Std. 9th & 10th.

Requirements of a modern Age)

Before we set out to resolve these issues we must set out a vision for ourselves. What are we aiming at?

Socially, we need an education system that is inclusive of all castes, religions & genders. Embracing such diversity can also promote value of tolerance. Furthermore education must be imparted in native vernacular language as far as possible.

Next we need to address what kinds of jobs are opening

up in the modern age. Everyone can't be doctor or an engineer. Today we have a lot of creative jobs in art, culture, drama, photography, etc. Moreover, we can have hands on training or Vocational Training compulsory as done in Germany.

New generation should embrace Technology as we are on the cusp of Industrial Revolution 4.0. Training in emerging fields like AI, cloud computing & data analytics should be made part of curriculum.

Teacher training and formalise Vocational education. The policy needs to be reflected on ground in letter & spirit.

To aid in foundational learning we can learn from Saksham programme of Haryana. Here schools in a district are certified saksham if they reach "grade competency".

The power of public participation can also be leveraged. We can encourage civil society to perform "Vidyanjali" or voluntary tutoring.

Technology can be an enabler in this regard. Children engage better with content that explains concepts through easy to understand videos. Pashupad

Model can be adopted where children were taught by local teacher on tablets, TVs etc. in local language.

Avoid dragging the same point

The use of Apps need to complement Hardware. New forms of pedagogy like "flipped learning" can be employed. The content can also be "Adaptive learning" - based which learns about child's strengths & weaknesses based on AI. Niti

Aayog had highlighted the Apps of "Unnayan Banks" as best practices.

Such an education needs to be accessible to all. In remote areas like tribal belt of Chhattisgarh we can set up makeshift bamboo schools, called "Pota Cabins". Other concepts like Eklavya Model Residential Schools should also be encouraged.

To meet all of these demands of modern age we might need a dedicated cadre of professionals working on this ~~end~~ goal. To this end,





